GATE

A huge thank you to the volunteers who work daily to keep our gate functioning. For safety reasons please do not push your clicker until you are at the gate. FYI, a device has been installed on the gate to detect sirens which will open the gate for the fire trucks and ambulance. Once this is activated the gate remains open for 1 hour. We do have the issue of non residents and delivery people attempting to use the gate. Sometimes we can prevent it, unfortunately, sometimes we can't. Safety first.

POOL RULES AND ETIQUETTE REVIEW

The pool has been resurfaced, it is absolutely beautiful and is waiting for you to plunge in!

While enjoying the pool we remind you and your guests to follow the safety rules posted in pool area. To insure everyone has a delightful day at the pool we also would like your help with the housekeeping items below.

☆If you have sunscreen, oil, or lotions on, please shower prior to entering the pool. The chemicals clog the filters and they are very costly to repair.

☆If you remove the rope buoy please reattach it when you are done. If the pool inspector comes to inspect the pool and nobody is in the pool and the rope is not attached they will close the pool.

☆Make sure the gates and doors are completely latched when you leave. Again, if the pool inspector comes and the gate is open and no one is in the pool area they will close the pool.

☆When you are finished using a lounge chair please return the back to the upright position and place it neatly along the fence being careful not to place them in front of the life rings.

☆The umbrellas need to be down when not in use; terrible things can happen when it gets windy!

☆Pushing the chairs back under the table helps preserve the seat cushions.

☆The pool gator requested that you turn the radio it off when you leave!

☆Dry off before entering the clubhouse. The floor gets very slippery when wet.

No one is allowed in the equipment area. No exceptions. It is locked for this reason. The pool company is responsible for all maintenance, and all adjustments needed for the pool. Contact Gina at 602-505-9893 If you feel something is wrong with the equipment, temperature or if something needs to be repaired.


